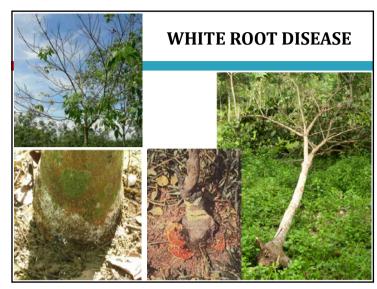

## **IMPORTANT RUBBER DISEASES**

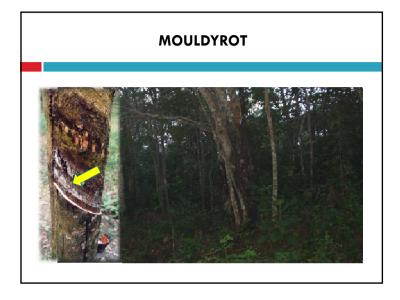
NO	DISEASES (PATHOGEN)
1.	White root (Rigidoporus microporus)
2.	Tapping panel dryness (physiology disorder)
3.	Corynespora leaf fall (Corynespora casiicola)
4.	Colletotrichum leaf fall (Colletotrichum gloeosporioides)
5.	Pink disease (Corticium salmonicolor)
6.	Stem/branch necrotic (Fusarium sp)
7.	Mouldy rot (Ceratocystis fimbriata)

# **Legislation and Law**

- □ Law No. 16 of 1992 : Animal, Fish, and Plant Quarantine
- □ Government Regulation No. 14 of 2002 : Plant Quarantine,

The importation of plant and its part thereof and/or other articles which may carry plant quarantine pests into the territory of the Republic of Indonesia, shall be:

- 1. Accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate (PC) from the country of origin and transit country;
- 2. Through the designated point of entry;
- 3. Notified and presented to Plant Quarantine Inspector at the point of entry for Plant Quarantine actions

Agricultural Minister Decree No. 861/Kpts/LB.720/12/1989: Prevention of entry of SALB into the territory of Republic Indonesia

#### 1. Prohibition:

Any importation of plant propagating materials of Hevea from the endemic countries essentially is prohibited.

#### 2. Restriction and treatment:

Any importation of plant propagating materials of Hevea and products of Hevea from the endemic countries is allowed with some requirements:

- importation only for government research purposes
- importation must have import permit from the Minister of Agriculture;
- must be treated in the country of origin
- must be free from soil
- accompanied by a PC from the country of origin or transit country

#### For propagating materials of non-Hevea:

- importation only for government research purposes
- importation must have import permit from the Minister of Agriculture;
- must be treated in the country of origin
- must be free from soil
- accompanied by a PC from the country of origin or transit country
- shall undergo post entry quarantine upon arrival in Indonesia

#### For products of Hevea:

- importation only for government research purposes
- importation must have import permit from the Minister of Agriculture;
- must be treated in the country of origin

#### For products of non-Hevea, passenger luggage, etc.:

• must be treated at the point of entry in Indonesia

## For propagating materials of Hevea in the form of seedlings:

- must be planting in the third country (outside Asia Pacific countries)
- accompanied by health certificate for plant pathologist which states that the seedlings are free from SALB
- shall undergo post entry quarantine on arrival in Indonesia

#### For propagating materials of Hevea in form of seeds:

- must be treated in the third country
- packing and containers should be replace with new ones in the third country
- accompanied by health certificate for plant pathologist in third country which states that those treatment have been done and seeds are free from SALB
- treated on arrival in Indonesia and shall undergo post entry quarantine.

#### 3. Treatment in Indonesia

Any importation of non propagating plant material of non-Hevea from the endemic countries must treated at the point of entry:

## a. Seeds or seedling, fresh plant products

- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 Watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m³, or
- Hot air treatment at temperature of 56 °C or more for 30 minutes, or
- Soaking in a solution of sodium hypochlorite (disinfectant) at a concentration of 200 ppm or more, followed by drying.

#### b. Dried plant products

- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 Watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>, or
- Hot air treatment at temperature of 56 °C or more for 30 minutes

#### c. Wood or timber products:

- $\bullet$  Steam heat treatment at temperature of 56  $^{\circ}\text{C}$  or more for 30 minutes , or
- Hot air treatment at temperature of 75 °C or more for 30 minutes

#### d. Grains

- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 Watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>, or
- Hot air treatment at temperature of 56 °C or more for 30 minutes, or

#### e. Fibre Products

- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 Watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>, or
- Steam heat treatment at 56 °C or more for 30 minutes, or
- Hot air treatment at temperature of 56 °C or more for 30 minutes

#### i. Packing Materials

- Spraying with disinfectants (sodium hypochlorite) 200 ppm or more, or
- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 Watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>

#### f. Passenger luggage

- Suitcases, shoes or footwear, and other hand carried luggage (spraying with sodium hypochlorite 200 ppm or more), or
- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 watt UV for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>

#### g. Vehicles and Containers

- · Washed with detergent and sprayed with pressurized water
- spraying with sodium hypochlorite 200 ppm or more

#### h. Equipments

- · Spraying disinfectants (sodium hypochlorite) 200 ppm or more, or
- UV Irradiation using ultraviolet light (253-257) nm for 60 minutes, with a specification 1 lamp of 40 watt UV lamp for a volume of 1.5 m<sup>3</sup>
- For equipments made of metal, wash with detergent and sprayed with pressurized water.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- Rubber producing countries (Asia and Pacific) should have the same perception on: the importance of SALB, efforts and actions to prevent the entry of SALB into the Asia-Pacific countries.
- 2. Government of Indonesia must:
  - Inform or socialize the importance of SALB and its introduction have impact on the rubber industry to all stakeholders
  - Create public awareness on SALB through various effective methods: short video at the waiting room of domestic and international airports
  - Produce and distribute leaflets about SALB to universities/schools, hotels, etc

- 3. Rubber Research Institute and Agricultural Plant Quarantine (as Immediate Programmes) should:
  - Organize or participate on seminar, conference, meeting to socialize the importance of SALB
  - Produce leaflets, banner, poster and organize training/meeting to farmers and other stakeholders in collaboration with private companies, like rubber processing factories, tyre's companies through their CSR funds
  - Create an identification training on SALB for plant quarantine officers, especially at the entry point
